A new / old tradition! On Palm Sunday, March 24th, Kristin and several helpers she has recruited will be offering fresh baked Hot Cross Buns. They will be for sale in packs and proceeds this year will go to our HVAC fund!

A Hot Cross bun is a spiced bun usually made with a fruit and marked with a cross on the top, traditionally eaten on Good Friday around the world, especially in places the United

Kingdom once ruled. Different traditions exist around the symbolism, but the buns evoke Christ's cross and the burial spices, but also the end of the Lenten season and anticipation of Easter and resurrection.
