Our lay leadership team will be nominating people to serve in necessary roles on our committees in the coming years and we'll be working to fine tune our processes. In some ways this is all routine, what we've "always" done, and in some ways it is new. Both / and. As we move into the future together, let me know your ideas, ask your questions, and pray about how you are called to help us take our next step in faith at First UMC. I am blessed to be on the journey with you here in Fort Scott.



The Beacon Challenge is Back!

For several years, 1st Presbyterian has challenged First United Methodist to see who could raise the most food for Fort Scott's "The Beacon" ministry each fall. And for several years, the Methodists won the Coveted Can Award fairly easily... BUT in 2022, the Presbyterians found their game and vastly outraised the Methodists, at long last taking the trophy for their own! (And far more importantly both churches have increased the amount they have given every year of our challenge! So, the Beacon wins!)

In 2023, the Methodists want the trophy back! By virtue of being the losing side last year, we are claiming the right to set the rules this year. So – we proposed a new twist on the challenge! **Theme weeks**, with the winner of each week decided by **total package weight** of the target items donated. The contest will run from Sunday, September 10th to Sunday, October 15th with totals shared by Monday at noon weekly and an 8th count of all "other items" donated made at the end of the contest. We will then celebrate and announce the winner with a shared potluck meal on Sunday, October 22nd. (*To be held at 1st Presbyterian as the defending trophy holders*.)

Weekly Themes:

Count I Sunday September 10th – Rice, Granola Bars, Nuts, Instant Potatoes, Ramen, Crackers & Cooking Oils (Olive and Canola)

Count 2 Sunday, September 17th – Pasta and Sauces

Count 3 Sunday, September 24th - Canned Fruits and Vegetables

Count 4 Sunday, October 1st – Boxed or Bagged Cereal, Powdered Milk

Count 5 Sunday, October 8th – Soup & Canned Meats/Fish (chicken, Spam, tuna, salmon, stew, chili, etc).

Count 6 Sunday, October 15th – Peanut Butter and Jelly (or similar).

Tiebreaker "Other Items" TOTAL - also tallied by Monday, Oct 16th

(includes all items not on list or brought after target date, by weight) Cash donations totaled here and count as One (1) pound per \$1.00

THE RULES:

- •Each weekly "Sunday" count is due by Mondays at noon, reported to the other church's office. Weight used is from item packaging. Weekly winner is the church that brings the most (by weight) of each item by that item's Sunday (aka by the Monday noon deadline...)
- •Items may be "saved up" to be counted during the target week if brought early, but once that item's week passes, any further donations of said item just become "other items donated" and are included in the tiebreaker, but not retroactively to the item's weekly count.
- •Church that wins 4 of the 6 "weekly" count wins the trophy if we spilt 3-3 on designated counts, an "other items and cash donated" tiebreaker is used.
- •Churches may choose to use donated weekly cash to have someone purchase items for a given week to try and win that week BUT cash used that way cannot then also be counted for the tiebreaker later.)
- •The overall goal, of course, is to continue the trend of each church donating more food (and cash) than last year so that "the Beacon wins!"





A Word on Giving

We ask for a lot - many Sundays there are 2 or 3 different special giving opportunities, in addition to our regular pleas for the church budget itself - and it can become a bit overwhelming. One reason is that there are such needs - but another is that we are the body of Christ - and we are created in diversity. Different giving opportunities speak to different people.

Pastor Christopher encourages you to prayerfully consider all your giving (within the church and beyond) and listen for what causes and opportunities speak most deeply to you.

Individually, few, if any of us, can contribute to everything that comes up - but each of us can make a difference with specific things and, together, our little becomes a lot!

God can do abundantly far more than we ask or imagine (Ephesians 3:20) - especially if we faithful and joyfully respond by giving to those opportunities where we feel the Spirit moving - and trust that others do as well.

UMCOR Helps Near and Far

One of the best things we do as United Methodist is respond to human and natural disasters through the United Methodist Committee on Relief UMCOR. They used to create a different

"advance number" for every incident but now they primarily use 3. For US events, the Advance # is For International Aid, the # is and if you specifically want to give but have UMCOR determine where funds are most needed, the Advance Number is #. You can give, through the church, anytime to any of these funds as the Spirit moves you. Simply mark your check UMCOR and use one of these numbers. (If no code is used we'll default to

the "most needed"). UMCOR works both directly and through partner agencies and 100% of donations to disaster relief go to disaster relief (because of events like UMCOR Sunday special offering, through which we fund the administrative costs).


