

Step Up to Tithing – Some More Thoughts on Stewardship

I sometimes find it a bit difficult to talk about money and giving. Some of that is that I personally struggled with it for a long time. Another part is that much of the church budget goes to pay the pastor – and so I'm basically fundraising my own pay. Awkward! But a few years ago, I read a pamphlet by one of my favorite theologians, Henri Nouwen. It was called "the Spirituality of Fundraising." He wrote that such campaigns are: "a



way of announcing our vision and inviting other people into our mission." Our mission at First UMC is about exemplifying Christ – telling the story of his birth, life, suffering, death, and resurrection, not only with words, but with how we live out our lives. We are committed to following Christ and inviting others to know, grow, serve and share!

Recently we've been blessed to have several new members and even more new constituents become actively involved – people who have seen who we are and want to become a part of it! It's exciting!

I believe in our mission and our congregation, and I am passionate about inviting you and others to take the next step on your journey – and part of that is how to share your monetary gifts. When I was first getting serious about my faith as a United Methodist and beginning to respond to (rather than avoid) a call to ministry, my pastor, Rev. Gayla Rapp, shared a chart similar to the "Step Up to Tithing" chart I sent our members (a copy is on the next page).

I found it helpful. I found it challenging. I found it a bit convicting – but not in a way that led to guilt or dread, rather one that led to seeing possibilities and becoming proactive about planning to give rather than giving what was left over. It took me deeper. I want to emphasize that this is not about guilt or what you "should" do – this is about opportunity and response. What you give is between you and God, and every stage of life is different, with different obligations and opportunities. Perhaps I shouldn't admit this, but Robin and I have never (yet) tithed our income. We have tithed some windfalls, but not yet our annual income. It is still a goal of ours – but not a lived reality. And yes, I have engaged in great debates about whether tithing is pre-tax or post-tax, if it counts other giving, etc. etc. Here's the thing – I don't care! Seriously. I, as your pastor, Do. Not. Care. how you answer those questions. You do you. Just pay attention to how the energy is being used – are you seeking to grow in faithful response - or are you rationalizing and hedging. Robin and I are at about 6% of our income total, given here and elsewhere. A bit more if you include seminary student loan payments. I did for a while, but decided to stop - mainly because I felt like I was trying too hard to make a claim to impress others, instead of faithfully responding to God. My goal is still to hit and then exceed 10% and we will, one day, get there. Not out of obligation, but out of joy and thanks.

The average church member in the US gives about 2.5%. Think of all we and our sister churches do with that amount - how God takes our little and makes a lot happen! Then imagine what we might do if the average was 3.5% or 5% or 10% or beyond! Might we do things "Greater Than..." I think we just might! I think Jesus promises we will. I think God is eagerly awaiting that day. Using the chart, I encourage to look at where you are now by whatever criteria you think is right, and then explore what taking one step farther along the path towards a tithe might look like for you. What would you need to do to make that happen? Again – no guilt, no pressure – but what does joyful giving look like for you? What would be sacrificial? What would help you feel yourself prioritizing God in response to the grace you've experienced?

And then, do something similar with your time and your non-monetary talents too. When Pastor Gayla showed me this chart, I was absolutely stressed over money. I did make a small commitment - for the first time I turned in a pledge card and it was 1% of our income - but more than that, I started really tracking my time. It led me to get serious about prayer... and prayer changed things. I started seeing opportunities, going deeper, being more aware of others. I stopped being angry all the time... I took the next step. This next week, I encourage you to take stock and be intentional about your next steps. God can do amazing things with joyful givers. 3

Tithe — a biblical standard, one-tenth of one's income, given as a contribution to support the ministry and mission of the church. A standard referred to often in the Hebrew scriptures (see: *Leviticus 27:30; Numbers 18:26; Deuteronomy 14:24; 2 Chronicles 31:5, Malachi 3:10*), the purpose of tithing is to teach us to put God first in our lives. In the New Testament, Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:21) Biblically, an offering is that which is given beyond this tithe and amounts below it are "giving." That said: Every gift, of whatever size, is important and appreciated, and every stage of life is different. Your pledge and giving should be free, joyful, and, yes, sacrificial. It should not, however, cause guilt, debt, or desperation.

Jesus' witness of the widow's mite (Mark 12:41–44) is *not* a call to make oneself destitute, it's a critique of a system that preys on the poor. On the other hand, Jesus' challenge to the rich young man (Matthew 19:16-22) to sell his possessions and give to the poor *is* a call to see how wealth and possessions can control and distract us. All we have is, ultimately, from God. We are blessed to be a blessing to others.


